When my mother taught at St. Pat's in the 50's/early 60's there was a lot of poverty. She would boil a dozen eggs + take bread, jam + butter to school for those who hadn't eaten. In the fall she would collect winter boots + mitts from the neighborhood + take them to school for the boys who came with wet feet. The School Lunch Program seemed to be the obvious choice of a charitable program to support.

Volunteer: She worked the Sunday evening shift at the gift shop at St. Clare's for many years.

Hobbies: All kinds of handicrafts: knitting, crocheting, tatting, painting, cooking + baking. A lot of the end products found their way to charitable bazaars + bake sales.
