Volunteer Work

While teaching in Carbonear, Led became Mayor of Harbour Grace, a position which he held for 25 terms. During these early years Led was beenly involved in Community affairs, and in 1979 was chosen as citizen of the year.
Over the years Led held many positions. He served as vice-chairman of the S. W. Moores Memorial Stadium for four years, was both chauman and vice-chairman of the Trinity-Conception Exhibition for 10 years, and held the post of chairmon of the Miss Afld and Labrador Contest for 13 years. He also served as president of the Coughton Mens Service Club, and superintendent of the United Church Sunday School. He was involved with the annual Harbour Grace Regatta for 13 years, and was a member Harbour Grace Recreation Commission.

While much of Jeal's volunteer work and group involvement took place shiring his active teaching career, Some of it continued after his retirement. It was only after a severe see of Throat lancer that much of his involvement was curtailed.
