Application for Funding

The Retired Teachers' Foundation funds charities which promote and advance the education, mental health, physical health, and well-being of children who are incapacitated, specifically in Newfoundland and Labrador.

Charities must be registered with the Canada Revenue Agency.

The charity must be a Newfoundland and Labrador children's charity or have a provincial presence.

The charity must submit an application profiling its organization/association/society.

The charity must state the specific purpose for which the donation will be used.

The charity will be expected to acknowledge the donation in the form of a general receipt or a letter.

Donations are disbursed in October at a general meeting of the RTANL/RTF. It is expected that a representative of each recipient charity be present to accept the cheque, and to explain how this donation will enhance the goals and purposes of his/her respective charity.
