NL RETIRED TEACHER'S FOUNDATION REPORT

On behalf of the Board of Directors of the **Newfoundland and Labrador Retired Teachers' Foundation**, may I once again wish everyone a Happy New year! You will find a more detailed message in the RTANL Newsletter of December 2017.

As noted there, the Foundation has had a busy and successful year. We have strived to continue, and to build upon, the Foundation's twofold mandate;

- 1. to assist Newfoundland and Labrador children with special needs through their respective charities, and
- 2. to remember the life and work of deceased teachers by compiling Books of Remembrance in their honour.

Recognizing an ongoing difficulty in collecting data for the Books of Remembrance, we have been working diligently to address this concern. With the help of the NLTA Communications team, we have formatted a standardized, online Book of Remembrance form that may be used by all divisions. The link is www.nlta.ca/rtfform. This form may be completed using present relevant information, then printed and filed amongst the member's important papers. Alternately, it may be used on the passing of the retired teacher.

We are currently compiling our latest Book of Remembrance. With the Newfoundland and Labrador database now up and running, we are ready to scan the most recent 91 forms received. Consequently, we are actively seeking a person or persons who would have the ability to undertake this worthwhile project. It is estimated to be a two-week project.
