During this session, participants discover why this concept is so crucial and how it empowers educators to overcome challenges, bridge inequities, and achieve goals that once seemed out of reach. Together, we'll reimagine what's possible when educators unite with a shared purpose and an unwavering belief in their collective potential to change lives.

Wednesday, July 9, 2025 (9:00 am – 4:00 pm)

Overcoming the Enemies of Efficacy to Achieve Implementation

Even though research is available to point educators in the right direction, quality implementation of evidence-based strategies remains a consistent and wide-spread challenge when it comes to school improvement efforts. One barrier to quality implementation is a diminished sense of collective efficacy amongst the faculty. In this

interactive session, Jenni will identify enemies of efficacy and explain how they hinder the implementation of evidence-based practices. Micro-moves that school leaders can use to overcome the enemies of efficacy will be shared.

Thursday, July 10, 2025 (9:00 am – 4:00 pm) Fostering Collective Teacher Efficacy

During this session, we'll explore research-based leadership practices that have been demonstrated to enhance collective teacher efficacy. Participants will be able to describe contextual factors that influence the formation of efficacy beliefs and assess the enabling conditions for collective efficacy in their environments. We will examine ways to foster efficacy beliefs through four research-based practices and identify actionable steps for fostering efficacy in schools.
